THE MESSENGER MAY 2012 FROM THE HEART OF THE LITTLE FISH



This past month we have lost four people to death. We lost Florence Yokley, 102, who was shy of her 103rd birthday by just a week or two... John Jones, 86... Heather Crites Duarte, 37 and Barbara Poe who celebrated her 73rd birthday in ICU surrounded by her family singing "Happy Birthday" to her.

As I was thinking about these folks and their families I thought about what our faith is all about, and why we need to believe. Florence was ready and waiting daily to meet God after she reached 100. John Jones had Alzheimer's these last few years and the night before he died he was reaching out to a light that he could see. Could it have been the heavenly messenger who had come for him? Heather was young and her death caught her family by surprise and she left five children who love her deeply. Barbara had been in the hospital for three weeks in ICU and I'm preparing for her service as I write these words. She went to her reward with her grandkids, daughter and husband, Allen, and some in-laws holding her hand until she was ushered through the gates of heaven.

Those families and our church family grieves. We lost some dear people of all ages. Yet there is hope. The apostle Paul says in Scripture that those who have lost loved ones at any time do not grieve like those who have no hope. Because Jesus died and rose again we believe one day we will join our loved ones and friends in heaven where we will walk the streets of gold, sing heavenly hymns, laugh, rejoice and enjoy the freedom of knowing there will be no more separation from our loved ones. This is the hope we have as Christians. This is the Easter message.

As a pastor it has been my privilege to assist many families in their time of need. The Celebration of Lives remind us of the joy of the Gospel message of salvation. Though we grieve, we don't grieve like those who have no hope. It reminds me that we always need to be spiritually ready for when our time comes and we, too, stand in the presence of God.

Death is a part of life. Dying is part of living again. Though we avoid the subject and we don't want to think about it and sometimes even joke about it, we will face our own Judgment Day. As pastor, my mission is to prepare us all to live victoriously now and to be ready when God calls us home.

But that is not my only mission. The second part of my mission is to bring comfort and hope and assurance to all who have been left behind. Knowing one day we will be reunited for all eternity gives us the hope that helps us to carry on. Knowing God's love never ends and His comfort is sure allows those who grieve to see light beyond the tunnel of darkness.

King David said it best when he wrote Psalm 23... "Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me."
